COST:

\$50 per class fee for participation, \$25 for free or reduced lunch qualifying families. The Musical will be \$100 total for the 4 sessions. Full or partial payment must be made by the first session in order for your child to participate. To use the reduced option online, please reach out Alyssa Hays or Tina Shepard. Students with an outstanding balance from Fall may have their registration delayed. Please contact Alyssa or Tina.

PAYMENT PLAN:

You may pay fees in monthly increments of \$50 due on the 5th of each month. Failure to pay by the 15th of the month without contacting Ms. Tina will cause your child to be removed from the program.

BEHAVIOR AND DISCIPLINE:

PEP staff and vendors work hard to get to know your child and understand how to work with them. Children may be removed from the program for safety issues or ongoing behavior problems. Please only sign your child up for classes they are interested in. We find that behavior issues mainly occur if kids are signed up for classes they are not interested in.

SCHEDULE:

Session will begin January 13th and end April 9th.

Session A pick up is **3:40**. Session B pick up is **4:45**. Staff leaves the school at 5pm. Three late pickups may result in removal from the program.

Wednesday early release: Students in the Panther Enrichment Program on Wednesday stay after school until the program sessions start at 2:40 on Wednesdays.

Madrona Runners Club and Girls on the Run: The running club will break into 2 groups in March with a 10 week pull out for Girls grades 3-5. That will straddle both Winter and Spring sessions.

Disney Musical: Disney's Aristocats Kids is open to 3-5th graders only. Rehearsals are both sessions Monday and Wednesday and during the early release Wednesdays. Rehearsals begin January 6 and performances are April 2 and 3. All Rehearsals and performances are mandatory for participating students. Tuition is \$100. Scholarships are available for qualifying students. Email arts4madrona@gmail.com with any questions.

Traditional Capoeira: This class will be a more disciplined martial arts class. Students will be asked to contribute additional funds towards uniforms and belt ceremonies. Scholarships for that will be available.

Daisies: Daisies will now be divided into a session A group and a session B group. Please choose one session. Smaller groups will improve the experience.

Girl Scouts: Brownies and Juniors will meet on Wednesday during early release on certain dates. Students not enrolled in PEP on Wednesday cannot stay during the early release time when Girl Scouts do not meet.

Seattle Music Partners: SMP will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays during session B. No new students will be added to SMP. SMP is not a PEP program and there is no cost to participate. PEP is not responsible or able to watch studens when SMP does not meet—please make other arrangements for care.

PARENT AGREEMENT

I give my consent for my student to participate in Panther Enrichment Program (PEP) sponsored by Madrona Elementary PTSA. My consent includes the following:

- Approval for my student to participate in walking field trips (destinations less than 5 miles from the school such as the Madrona Playground/Park, Madrona Garden, Larkins Park, and Madrona Beach). I understand the inherent risks of participating in these activities.
- I understand that the staff has high expectations of my child and that they will follow all Madrona Elementary rules. I have discussed the appropriate behavior with my child and I understand that my child must follow all school rules while in the program, or they will face discipline under normal school policy. Recurring behavior issues may result in disciplinary action including a verbal warning, a call home, and removal from the program. I understand that if my child is removed from the program for repeated behavior issues after the third week, a refund will not be made.
- I understand that the school nurse will not be available during the programs and will not be responsible for my child's healthcare needs. In the case of an emergency, I consent to emergency treatment, hospital care and procedures deemed immediately necessary by a physician to safeguard my child's health if I cannot be contacted. I waive my rights to informed consent of such treatment. If my child needs any accommodations, I will contact the PEP coordinator or PEP director.
- PEP builds community authentically and supports diversity. I support the inclusive and welcoming nature of the program which will not discriminate based on age, race, gender, or sexuality of students, vendors, or volunteers.
- Once I have registered my student in after school activities it is my responsibility to ensure my student attends these programs. Program staff and volunteers will take daily attendance at each activity and it is my student's responsibility to be in their assigned program. I can call the PEP Director or front office to check on their attendance.
